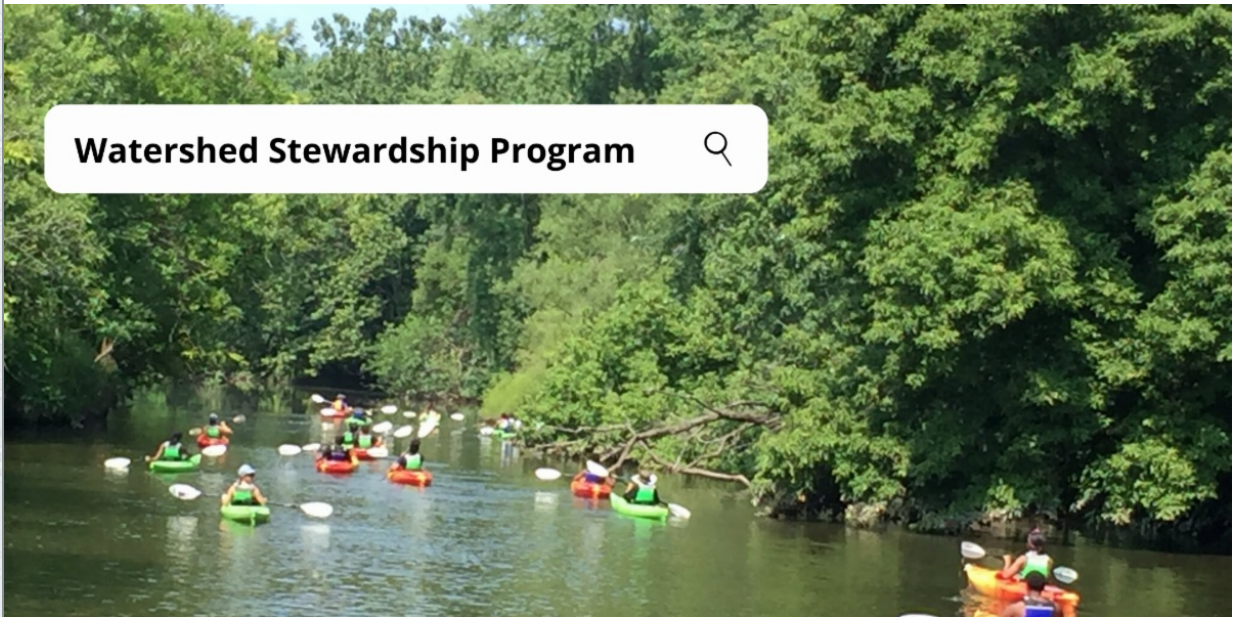

Philadelphia Watershed Stewardship Updates

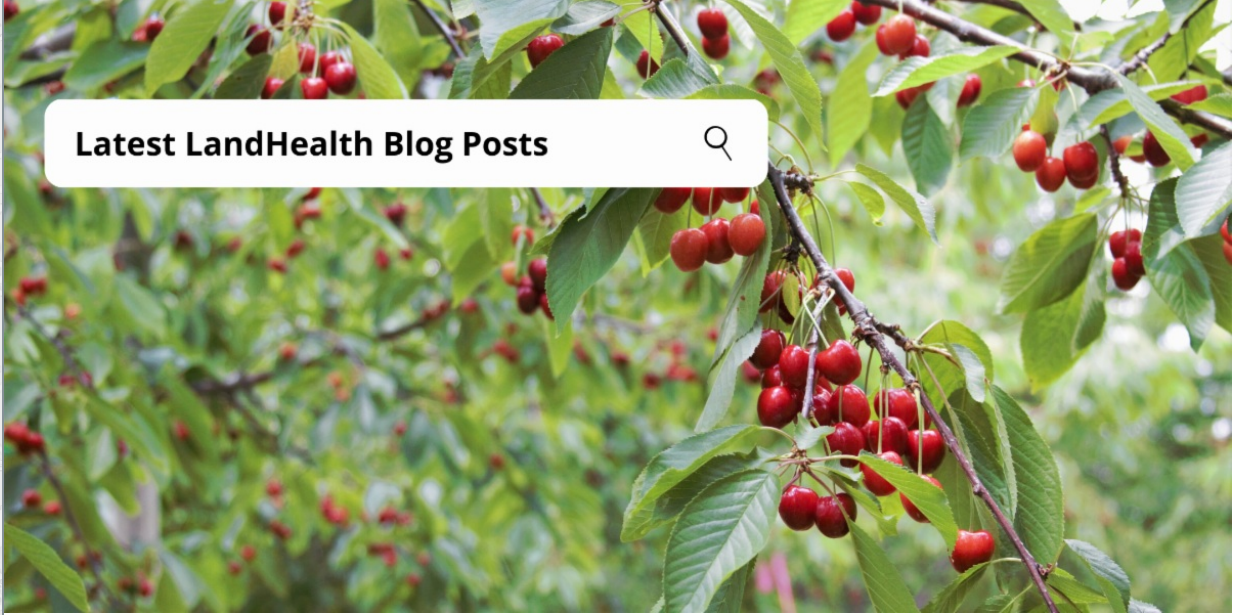
This week is the fourth week of the Philadelphia Watershed Stewardship Program! This week, the stewards are learning about sustainability and waste. A large part of sustainability is the zero waste movement. Zero waste is a set of principles focused on waste prevention that encourages the redesign of resource life cycles so that all products are reused. 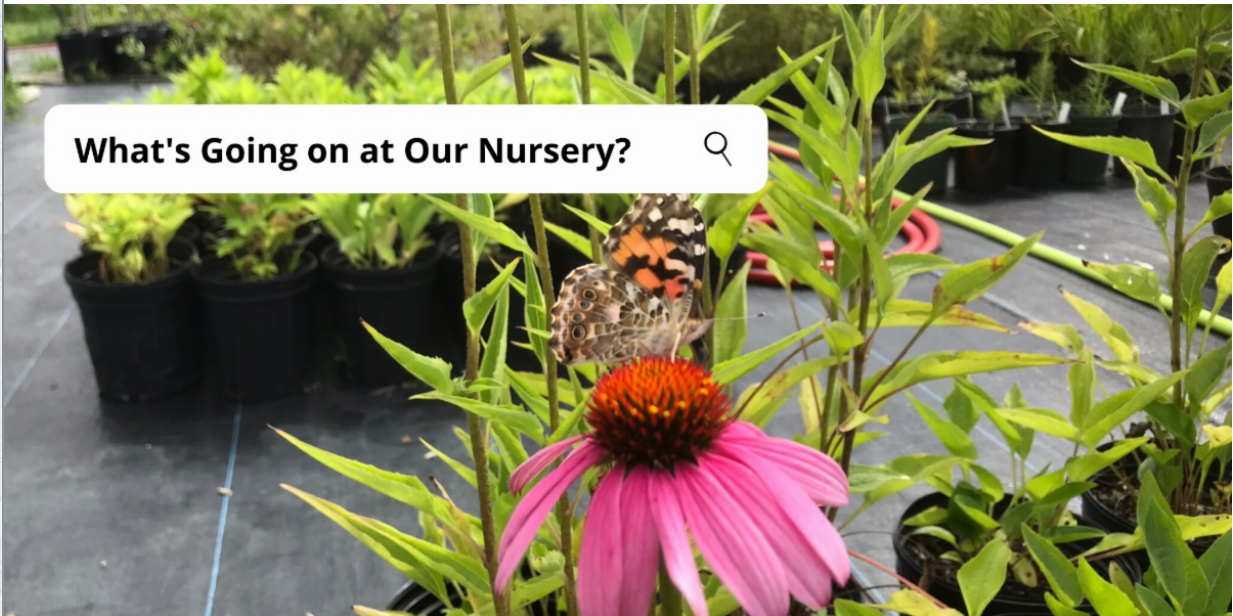

What's Going on at Our Nursery?

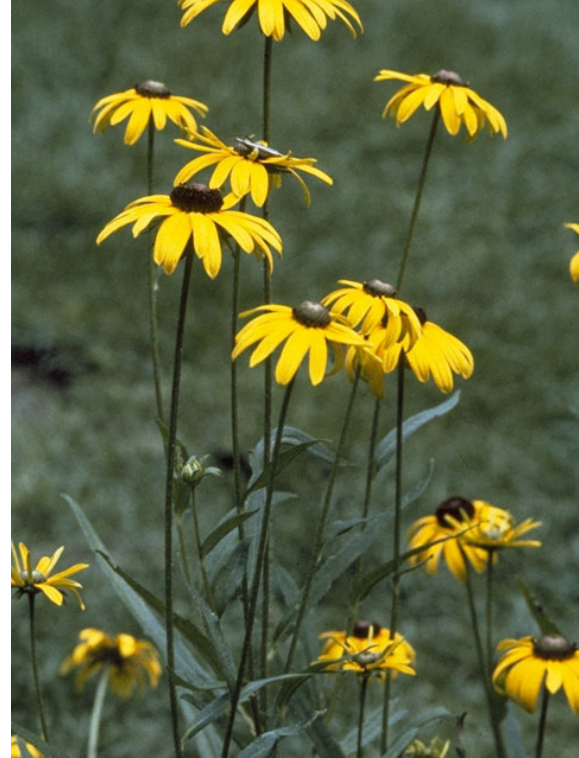


Look at the Rudbeckia Fulgida growing at our nursery right now!
