Coming Soon: New Cobbs Creek Trail Signs

Next time you are in Cobbs Creek, keep an eye out for new trail signs, with helpful information on native plants and animals, as well as new directional signs with key points of interest. LandHealth provided guidance on hyper-native plant and wildlife species for the Cobbs Creek area, and we provided many of the photos you will see on the new

signs, as well as many of the plants used in the restoration of this area. To learn more about the natural environment of the Whitby Meadows section of Cobbs Creek, check out our recent *Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) report*.

The plants in the Nursery are being taken care of and protected by Steve, our Nursery Director.

He has been covering the plants with frost cloths and doing a lot of weeding. Steve is also getting ready to sell some of the plants to home owners this spring. He is also getting the plants ready for a project this spring which will involve planting at Sister Cities Park for the Center City District, a community park at Cook Elementary in Logan, and other projects.

The **#plantoftheweek** is Liverwort. Liverwort is an interesting type of plant that can be confused with mosses. Like mosses, liverworts



have no vascular system (the veins of familiar flowering plants), and they reproduce by spores. There are thousands of species of liverworts all over the world. A few specialize in making their home in nurseries and greenhouses. Though liverworts are very interesting plants with an unearthly look, some species can also be a nuisance in a greenhouse. At LandHealth all of our weeding is done by hand and we don't use any chemical herbicides to take care of the weeds.
