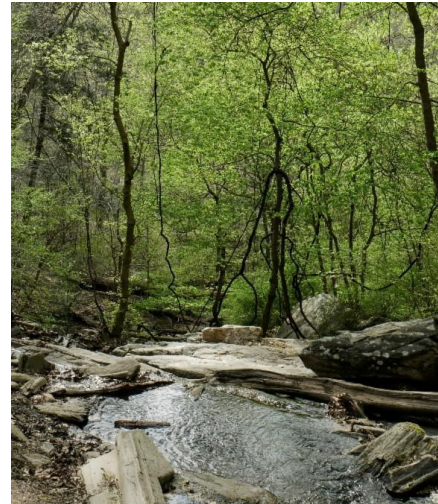




The Week Ahead

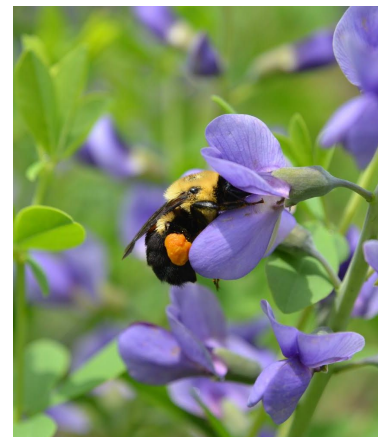
